#### Sovereignty


- Treaties of Westphalia ...
  - granted permission to emigrate
  - protected the property of emigrants
  - regulated the return of refugees of war
  - granted safe passage for the purpose of trade
  - restricted exit fees




#### Sovereignty

- US Declaration of Independence (1776): "pass [laws] to encourage [foreigners'] migration hither."
- VP Mike Pence (2018): Caravan of migrants is "a blatant disregard for our border and sovereignty."




- Top-down & bottom-up
